On Sunday morning, one encounters a warm, inviting welcome and a sense of belonging. Little ones maneuver their way through the maze of people while our many teen members spread throughout the building. The high level of energy, attention, and acceptance of our children and teens is apparent. Among the people, one hears sounds of joyous laughter as people share stories of celebration. The happy sounds are mingled with tender words of support to those who are hurting. All around, there are embraces that express to all of our friends at Peace Church that they are not strangers, but members of an extended family.

At our worship, one hears the joyful litany of announcements celebrating the incredible outreach and missions of Peace Church. The vibrant energy in worship provides a sense of motivation and renewal for those who participate. The sanctuary is filled with beautiful music lifted up by our many church musicians, our congregational singing, and the amazing talents of our choirs and praise teams. The constant movement, participation, and joyful noise of our children adds to the welcome in our worship services. Having children present in worship helps to create a comfortable, relaxed environment at both the traditional and contemporary services. Children feel comfortable at our Prayer Place space in our sanctuary, which was designed to give our youngest members a place to color, play, and interact during the worship services. If families prefer, there is nursery care available.

The morning messages are applicable to current events, inclusive, empowering, and challenging and are all designed to inspire the congregation to share the radical Good News of God's open and affirming love with all people in new and powerful ways.

Following the worship services, one can experience fellowship time from 9:45-10:45a or lunch after the 11:00a service. Between services. Faith Formation is provided for children, youth, and adults. Faith Formation provides opportunities for our children, youth, and teens to develop theological understandings and to experience Jesus' message. Our Faith Formation philosophy is to create a safe environment where questions of exploring one's faith are welcome and freely asked. It also encourages opportunities to build positive intergenerational relationships that provide a strong Christian faith foundation. Special intentionality is made to weave each Sunday's theme together in all aspects of our Sunday morning (eg, Children's Message, Faith Formation, songs, etc).

A wide range of ministry opportunities exist at Peace Church. Included in these ministries are Bible studies, small groups, diverse music, local missions and outreach, international and UCC mission involvement, and a strong commitment to social justice action and advocacy. As a result of the incredible ministry by so many at Peace Church, many lives are changed and transformed, and our church family continues to grow.

At Peace Church, we continually welcome visitors and new members. As a result, our congregation has become younger and has a youthful spirit which brings new excitement, energy, blessings, and numerous possibilities for ministry to Peace Church and the wider community. We are a unique congregation who is willing to be bold, take risks, and welcome creativity. The empowerment and direction of the pastoral staff and the many lay people has strengthened the journey of Peace Church and greatly expanded all of our ministries. Ministry Description:

We are a congregation of family as opposed to a congregation of strangers. At Peace Church, we worship together, break bread together, laugh together, cry together, learn together, and walk hand-in-hand with each other no matter where we are on life's journey. Our church community is Open and Affirming (ONA). We believe strongly in social justice and living our faith outside of the church walls. We are seeking a full-time Associate Pastor who is engaging, joy-filled, and genuine – someone who will collaborate with our current staff and congregation in growing our church in faith and spirit. We are seeking a pastor who will partner with others to continue developing our children, teen, and young adult ministries as well as pursue their own passion for social justice and peace inside and outside the church.

Rochester is a unique, thriving city of 120,000 in southeastern Minnesota. Our city is consistently ranked as one of the best places to live in the United States. Rochester is known nationwide for Mayo Clinic. It's a city that has a small-town feel within an urban setting surrounded by agriculture and nature. It's a city that has something for everybody.

Rochester is a safe, family-centered community with excellent school systems and an exceptionally high quality of life. It continuously invests in itself through improvements in entertainment, dining, and outdoor recreation. Every year, Rochester hosts thousands of people from all over the world for employment or the world-renowned healthcare, both of which are offered by Mayo Clinic. Because of this, there is a strong focus on health and wellness as well as a growing number of multicultural and recreational activities and opportunities.



Scope of Work

We are seeking a full-time Associate Pastor to assist in providing leadership with our church's children, teens, and young adults. The Associate Pastor should be ordained (or on the ordination track) and provide leadership in the development and evolution of the Faith Formation program for children, teens, and adults. The Associate Pastor will collaborate with the Senior Pastor for worship and preaching leadership opportunities. Our new Associate Pastor will engage in the full life of the church and partner with the Senior Pastor in leading weekly worship services in addition to other special and seasonal worship services. The Associate Pastor will assist the Senior Pastor in developing and carrying out a plan for assigned visitation and pastoral care.

We seek a person who will:

- Engage fully in the life of the church
- Passionately help others develop their spirituality as a life-long process
- Motivate and empower people to utilize their gifts
- Identify strongly with children and teens and advocate for their needs
- Exhibit a strong understanding of the United Church of Christ theological foundation and integrate it into various life situations
- Be an integral part of our pastoral staff, lay staff team, and church family

We envision our next Associate Pastor to lead the development and evolution of our children, teen, and young adult ministries. They will also develop social action ministries and build on current initiatives within the church. Finally, the Associate Pastor will assist us in living our mission by teaming up with church leadership, ministry teams, and the congregation to live the radical, inclusive Good News both inside, and especially outside, the church walls.

Our vision of the Associate Pastor we are seeking is to play an integral role assisting in providing pastoral care to every member of our congregation, whether or not they can make it to church on Sunday. Every individual is a vital part of Peace. That's why the pastor will prioritize ministry and care to individuals in the church, in their homes, and in other care settings.

The Associate Pastor will strengthen relationships with current community programs as well as seek out additional opportunities for social justice ministries and programming. They will also continue to build on the relationship with the sanctuary movement.

"We are looking for someone who is fun, energetic, and outgoing. We want someone who is non-judgmental and is a good listener. We like to do fun things and learn, but sometimes we like to just sit and talk about things that are important to us. Please come prepared with an open mind and lots of ideas for fun activities. Our church is involved in many organizations which provide resources for the outcast, stranger, and struggling. We operate two food pantries and were the first Sanctuary Church in the area. Additionally, we support other community outreach endeavors such as highway adoption and clean-up. Other organizations we are partnered with include Channel One Food Pantry, Family Promise Rochester, the Rochester Women's Shelter and Support Center, LINK (Living Independently with Knowledge), Project Legacy, Planned Parenthood, and many others.

We have also been active in community organizations and social issues such as ISAIAH, MLK Day, Black History Month celebrations, peace rallies, immigration reform rallies, Pridefest (major financial sponsor), March For Our Lives, Vote NO campaign, etc.

Strengths and Positive Qualities:

Our congregation's greatest strength is following God's call of inclusion and affirmation of all people. We are an Open and Affirming (ONA) congregation and welcome and affirm everyone, regardless of physical or mental ability, relationship status, sexual orientation, race, ethnicity, age, or religious affiliation. As the "light on the hill," we are a sanctuary for our community members who have been marginalized, outcast, and/or oppressed.

Peace Church is a very giving congregation. This is demonstrated through our status as a 5 for 5 Church, and financial support numerous organizations. Additionally, we financially support Samaritan Bethany Inc., a care facility in Rochester that Peace Church was integral in establishing in 1922. Peace Church members invest their time, talents, and treasures into various community-based organizations by offering support and space for those organizations to conduct their meetings or business.

Our church excels in providing creativity in all aspects of our ministry. This includes complete engagement with our children and teens in the full life of the congregation. Through music, worship, and service we all work together to share God's love with others. We do take our ministry very seriously...but we have a LOT OF FUN doing the work we are called to do.

Most importantly, Peace Church provides a welcoming environment that feels like home for many. Our casual/comfortable, 'come as you are' attitude allows many to feel loved and accepted. Through our commitment to missions, creative and engaged worship and ministries, as well as a strong sense of community, many feel emboldened to engage in ministry.





Worship:

At Peace Church, we offer worship opportunities to meet the varied needs of our congregation. We offer both a traditional and a contemporary service each Sunday. During the summer, we have only one service. Additionally, we offer several special services throughout the year such as Taize, Blue Christmas, non-traditional Christmas Eve-Eve Services, Ash Wednesday, Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, etc.

Each service is filled with energy, passion, and the Spirit with messages that center on how the radical Good News engages in our lives today. Our congregation is full of individuals from diverse backgrounds and belief systems, all of whom can find meaning in our worship services.

Worship planning is coordinated by the Senior Pastor with input/planning from the Associate Pastor, the worship planning team, and the church musicians. We celebrate baptisms throughout the year, and Communion is celebrated on the first Sunday of every month as well as on special days (World Communion Day, Christmas Eve, Ash Wednesday, Maundy Thursday, Easter, etc.). Each week our services are uniquely different, and creativity has become the norm. It is through this unique creativity that people find themselves touched, moved, and inspired while on their faith journey.

Children are always welcome at Peace Church. We have a nursery area for children ages three and under where parents are welcome to sit with their children. We also have "busy bags" available in the back of the church to keep children entertained. In 2017, we created our Prayer Place which gives families a place for their children to get a better view of the service while engaging their bodies and minds. It is located at the front of the sanctuary and is stocked with coloring sheets, floor pillows, and books. Families are asked to manage their own children's use of the space to ensure it is a welcome place for all.



The new Associate Pastor will oversee the weekly Children's Message in coordination with the Welcome Desk Coordinator. Many church member volunteers are currently reading books, relating to the weekly Faith Formation theme, to the children during their message time. Recent books have taught lessons about recycling, gender inclusivity, the role of service dogs, and other topics we feel are important for our children to learn about.

Faith Formation:

Our Faith Formation vision is to create an inter-generational community of disciples. Our church is committed to social justice and radical hospitality, and our Faith Formation curricula reflects this. Faith Formation is held between services, with classes for preschool, elementary, middle and high school levels. Preschool and elementary students begin with music time before breaking into the respective age groups for lessons and crafts. Themes from Faith Formation are interwoven with the lectionary in order to connect it with the worship services and the Children's Message.



Teens use a lectionary-based curricula that is devoted to studying the Bible's relevance to contemporary issues. We have an active teen group that focuses on fun, spirituality, and service. We are intentional about fostering intergenerational life. We foster opportunities for teens to help with younger children and look for appropriate occasions for teens to participate with adult Faith Formation. Additionally, we have a dynamic Confirmation Program, pairing each confirmand with an adult mentor during their study.



We have a Teen Activities Director on staff to facilitate social and/or fellowship opportunities in addition to special mission-focused activities. The Teen Activities Director will work directly with the Associate Pastor to plan and coordinate teen mission trips, special conferences, national youth events, etc.



Ministry and Mission Organization:

The center of our ministry is the congregation. Every member is encouraged to participate and engage in some form of ministry. All major decisions (calling pastors, budget, building projects, missions, etc.) are all approved by the congregation. Once agreed upon, the leadership and staff of the church is empowered to move forward.



To implement its mission and ministry, Peace Church has a 12-member church council which usually consists of six women and six men. The Senior Pastor, Associate Pastor, and Church Administrator serve as "ex-officio" members of the council with voice but no vote. There is an executive council consisting of president, vice-president, past president, treasurer, and secretary that meets separately with the Senior Pastor. The church council meets monthly and leads annual and semi-annual congregational meetings.


Peace Church developed a ministry team model of ministry 17 years ago to more effectively and efficiently create and implement ministry. The Faith Formation, Social Action, Visibility, Vitality/Hospitality, and Worship teams each focus on their specific areas of ministry. There is a great deal of collaboration between the teams to provide interactive themes and direction.

Lay leadership is widely utilized and encouraged at Peace Church. Lay individuals use their diverse gifts and strengths to lead though technology, music, faith formation, men's and women's fellowship, the coordination of weddings, funerals, worship services, fellowship coffee time, transgender support group, and much more.

Our church leadership and staff work together on many ministries of the church. Vision and direction is guided by our Senior Pastor. We are currently seeking an Associate Pastor to work jointly with him and church leadership, to develop dynamic and creative ministry. The ministry team (staff and lay leadership) coordinate with the Church Administrator and the Welcome Desk Coordinator to manage, market, and coordinate social and ministerial events.

Our music team is comprised of three individuals: one is responsible for music leadership at the traditional service (piano and organ), the second is responsible for the contemporary service music as well as the ONEVOICE group, and the third is responsible for leading the choir and handbells.





Peace Church has a great bond and relationship with their pastors. The congregation is very supportive and receptive of the pastoral staff. There is a strong collegial relationship between the members of the pastoral staff and other staff members. Open communication, trust, and independence to utilize gifts and skills in specific areas of ministry are paramount to a vital relationship between the pastoral staff. Peace Church is known for having a strong, positive pastoral model that allows for empowering leadership to occur, and has been blessed by dynamic, engaging, and relational pastors who have created powerful worship and ministry for Peace Church and the wider community.


2019 Stewardship Theme







Because Rochester is home to Mayo Clinic, most of our congregation works in the medical field. The remainder of our congregation is composed of teachers, tradespersons, clerical, students, laborers, business owners, and other professionals.



Peace Church is predominantly Euro-American; however, we have a growing multicultural membership.

We continue to have conversations about welcoming diversity through our ongoing Race Forward group that meets to discuss and share information that increases awareness of race and white privilege. This bridges to other small-group discussions. Additionally, this is a frequent topic in Sunday worship.

During 2019, transfers were made from our Special Accounts. \$46,200 + \$15,000 was transferred from our endowment funds to pay for our building finishing plus microphone upgrade and security door locks which was approved by council. Another \$28,000 was transferred from our endowment funds to reimburse back to capital account.

Peace Church's annual budged expense dollars is \$516,637. Refer to Addendum B for our 2020 budget.

Of those expense dollars, 32% is comprised for ministerial support.

We have always met our financial obligations to pay our staff. In January 2019, the opportunity arose for us to make an intentional decision to restructure our staffing model and institute a specialized lay ministry model. This allowed lay persons, with specific skill-sets, to provide direction and leadership in programming, Faith Formation, missions, and marketing. We eliminated our Associate Pastor position to provide funding to implement this new model. We soon realized, however, that this new model was not providing the theological and pastoral

depth and support needed to implement our ministry. As a result, we have reestablished the Associate Pastor position.

We are proud to call ourselves a 5 for 5 Church. Through the generous giving of our members, we were able to support the various ministries of the UCC in 2019 as follows:

Our OCWM dollars are collected from specific donations and then general mission money raised throughout the year - all of which is to the conference.

Peace Church's total indebtedness consists of two loans in the amount of \$548,446.12. These loans were taken for our recent building addition / remodel. We do, however, have \$308,640 pledged over the next two years. Although construction is complete, we will be focused on a final debt reduction campaign in 2020/2021. Refer to Addendum C for our current Building a Bigger Table Campaign details.

We currently have four separate endowment accounts. The current market value of these accounts are as follows:

\$15,074.07 Memorial \$214,562.19 Penz/Peace Other \$16,208.69 Schroedel

\$64,027.66 Trachsel

The Memorial Account is held for specific expenditures agreed to by the council and Memorial Committee members; Schroedel and Trachsel Accounts are held for annual scholarships; disbursements are authorized by a separate scholarship committee. Penz/Peace Other Account is also used for annual scholarship (disbursements are made by the same Schroedel / Penz scholarship committee) as well as back-up for church expenses. All authorizations for disbursements must go through council.

The church council has authorized disbursements up to \$25,000 annually to be used for expenses. This is only done if/when needed.

While the interest earned on our endowment funds fluctuates based on the economy, special attention is given to ensure that these funds remain in place for emergencies only. The congregation receives updates on the status of these accounts during our semi-annual and annual meetings.

In addition to our church building and parsonage, we also have a shed on our property.

Reflection: Members of Peace Church are very generous in their giving of time, talent, and treasure. They continue to strongly support the various components of our ministry from missions, staffing, programming, building expansion and remodeling.

Peace Church does own a parsonage which is located right next door to our church (1521 2nd Avenue NE, Rochester, MN). The home is currently being rented, but is available in July 2020 if desired. The church (Senior Pastor, building supervisor, and church administrator) are responsible for reviewing and making necessary repairs.

Through the years, Peace Church has been able to manage important changes and conflict involving our congregation. Some are:



Sanctuary Church:

In 2017, our Social Action and Outreach Committee came to the council to ask about moving forward about becoming a Sanctuary or Sanctuary-supporting congregation. On May 7, 2017, the congregation voted to approve the following statement:

The members of Peace United Church of Christ declare our intent to move forward to becoming a sanctuary or sanctuary-supporting church. As a congregation we are compelled to welcome the stranger, love our neighbor and provide care for those in need.

Four groups were created to provide information to the congregation: education / forums, policy, advocacy, and facilities. Updates from these groups were presented to the congregation at the Sept 24, 2017 Semi-Annual meeting. After more discussion, the congregation voted on the following motion:

The members of Peace United Church of Christ are compelled by our faith to welcome the stranger, love our neighbor, and provide care for those in need. We therefore declare that we are a Sanctuary Church. This includes providing emergency housing for an immigrant at immediate risk for removal from the country who, with access to a fair hearing, has a reasonable chance of receiving a stay of removal. This also includes advocating for a humane immigration policy in accordance with our faith.

A closed ballot vote was taken with an 89% approval of the above statement. While not everyone was in agreement, and a few members chose to leave Peace Church, it allowed us, as a congregation, to step up and put our faith into action. Peace Church continues to uphold our values and practices when it comes to conflict. The Sanctuary Church discussion created an opportunity to more clearly discern who we are... calling us to be a strong, vital faith community for all in the Rochester area. Since that time, the congregation has continued to grow in spirit and unity and hold strongly to our convictions. We have learned to exercise faithful, positive, and healthy discussions knowing that not everyone will agree. Regardless of the difficulty of these conversations, it is our calling to stand for injustices and to use our voice to show love to everyone.

Listos Preschool and Childcare:

Listos Preschool and Childcare: As part of our 2020 visioning process, we wanted to focus on utilizing our church space for a preschool. A proposal was brought to the congregation in the fall of 2014 to help fund the start-up costs of Listos Preschool and Childcare (a dualimmersion preschool and childcare center) and the congregation approved; Listos paid back the entire loan. Listos is now thriving and has begun its 5th year of operation with the highest number of students enrolled (37). Peace UCC continues to support and welcome the diversity of the children and teachers utilizing our space for the betterment of the community. Listos operates independently with their own Board of Directors but sits under the umbrella of Peace UCC for 501(c)3 status.

We are fortunate that no past leader has left Peace Church under pressure or by involuntary termination. We have never been involved in a Situational Support Consultation nor have any of our past pastors been the subject of a Fitness Review while serving at our church.

Peace Church is actively involved in association, conference, and other denominational programs and activities of the wider United Church of Christ. Delegates are regularly sent to Minnesota Conference meetings and members have served as delegates and visitors to General Synod.

We expect and encourage our pastoral staff to attend the Minnesota Conference meetings and take responsibility in Minnesota Conference activities as appropriate. Since we are one of the largest congregations in the Conference, we expect the Associate Pastor to participate and be a presence at the Conference level.

Lay leaders of Peace Church closely identify with the United Church of Christ and have had a very strong and positive relationship with the Minnesota Conference and the United Church of Christ National Office.

It is known that many churches love to tell the story of what they are doing in the community to transform lives. It is important to share that we are officially an A2A, God is Still Speaking (GISS), and Open and Affirming (ONA) church. We are actively involved with Creation, Economic, Border and Immigration Justice issues, and Global Ministries outreach.



Peace Church is known in Rochester as the central faith community for issues of justice. We are always open to exploring new options of justice and peace, with intentional focus on creation justice over the next two years.

Peace Church works collaboratively with other faith communities on issues of justice. The pastoral staff has a unique partnership with Christ United Methodist and the UU congregation working together on inclusion, Sanctuary Church, and justice work. We are also part of an interfaith group called RAIL (Rochester Area Interfaith Leaders) that calls leaders of all faiths/traditions together.

Our mission statement is center to all of our ministries and worship.... "a safe and inclusive church living God's radical message".



We believe strongly that our pastoral staff is active and present in the community and wider church. The pastoral duties of Peace Church are the highest priority. Some of the ministry that occurs within the scope of Peace Church overlaps with community and wider church outreach. It is through many ministries and duties that our pastors become involved with wider community and church outreach.

Mission InSight

The Mission InSite report for our neighborhood area reflects a growing population with an increase in our non-Caucasian neighbors. This growth is an exciting opportunity for us to realize new models of ministry. Peace Church's current missional involvement in the community provides a great opportunity to connect with diverse cultures. The report shows an above-average interest in worship participation and experiencing genuine worship compared to the general U.S. population. It also indicates they have a preference for a warm friendly faith community.

While we are experiencing growing diversity in our Peace Church community, it is not keeping pace with the wider Rochester demographics. We need to explore new ways and engage with our neighbors including opportunities for dialogue to better identify how we can foster stronger connections.

Through outreach with Listos Preschool and Childcare utilizing our building and Christway Full Gospel Church worshiping in our sanctuary, we are beginning to find new connections with our neighbors. Much more work needs to be done in this area.

Peace Church is widely known in the community for having open doors and providing key leadership and support on issues of justice, peace, and inclusion. We have become the go-to place to garner support and provide a safe place for meetings and other events. We also hear a lot of 'thank yous' from our community neighbors.

Peace United Church of Christ – Rochester, MN Associate Pastor Job Description

Seeking an ordained (or ordination track) pastor who will work with and report to the Senior Pastor of Peace United Church of Christ. The Associate Pastor will assist in providing leadership with:

CHILDREN: Provide leadership, oversight, and direction to develop a comprehensive children's ministry and faith formation program by identifying/developing curriculum, training and organizing leaders, and engaging fully in this ministry.

TEEN/YOUNG ADULTS: Give priority to mentoring persons in this key life transition time, with the goal of assisting persons' involvement in and commitment to the church and its mission. Help teens and young adults interpret their day-to-day experiences through the lens of faith.

FAITH FORMATION: Identify the educational needs of children, teens and adults at Peace Church and develop programs to meet needs. Educational goals are in agreement with the total mission of the church and integrated with whole-church educational themes.

WORSHIP/PREACHING: Develop worship services and preach as scheduled. Share in the worship leadership with special and seasonal worship services.

SOCIAL ACTION: Provide leadership and involvement with our various social action/mission ministries and our Sanctuary Church involvement.

PASTORAL CARE: Assist the Senior Pastor in developing and carrying out a plan for assigned visitation and pastoral care.

RESPONSIBILITIES:

- 1. Provide leadership and direction for Children, Teen and Young Adult Ministries of Peace Church
 - Develop weekly age-appropriate, active learning opportunities and curricula to engage
 the spiritual development needs of teens during Sunday morning Faith Formation. This
 includes finding and/or writing curricula to correlate with whole-church learning themes.
 - Collaborate with our Teen Activities Director to develop meaningful social activities / volunteering events and retreats for teens (including summer mission trips or other trips).
 - Collaborate with lay leaders to develop meaningful social activities/volunteering events and retreats for children.
 - Assist in coordinating and leading the Confirmation Program.
 - Invest in relationships with children, teens, and adults within the church, provide pastoral
 care and support, show up for significant life events (i.e. graduation parties and occasional
 sporting events).
- Work in conjunction with other staff, provide support for the overall ministry of Peace Church by providing spiritual, pastoral, educational, and administrative leadership and support to our congregation.
 - Be fully present and relationally invested in significant events in the life of the church and in the lives of the Peace Church community.
 - Participate in regular staff and planning meetings.
 - Participate in Church Council and Leadership meetings as needed.
