Debt Reduction Capital Funds Campaign: Status

Through your generous pledges, \$303,640 of the \$600,000 debt reduction goal has been met in pledges (as of August 19). Those who have pledged represent a little more than 10% of our congregation. Each Sunday we remind ourselves that "This is OUR church...we make it what it is." Just imagine what can be accomplished if <u>everyone</u> participates, not just the 10%!

One of our existing loans matured in June. Because of that, Merchant's bank was generous to grant us another 3-year loan at 4.75% interest only. This means that our monthly payments will fluctuate as we continue to pay down the principal. When this debt is retired, these funds will be freed to sustain and grow the life and ministry of the unique and inclusive spiritual community that exists at Peace. In any given week, Peace's facilities are not only home to Sunday worship and educational activities, but also to many community groups who find a refuge here.


